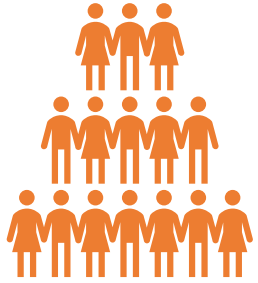

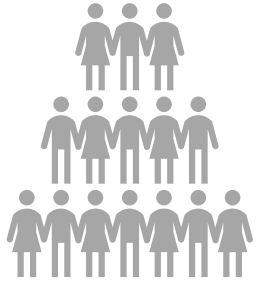


Three in-person

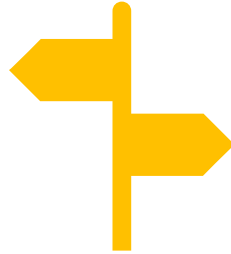
- Focus on the basics of asset management from the elected official's perspective.

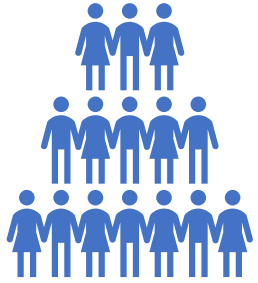

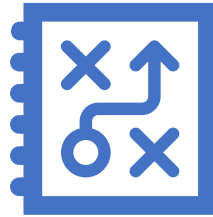
Group learning
