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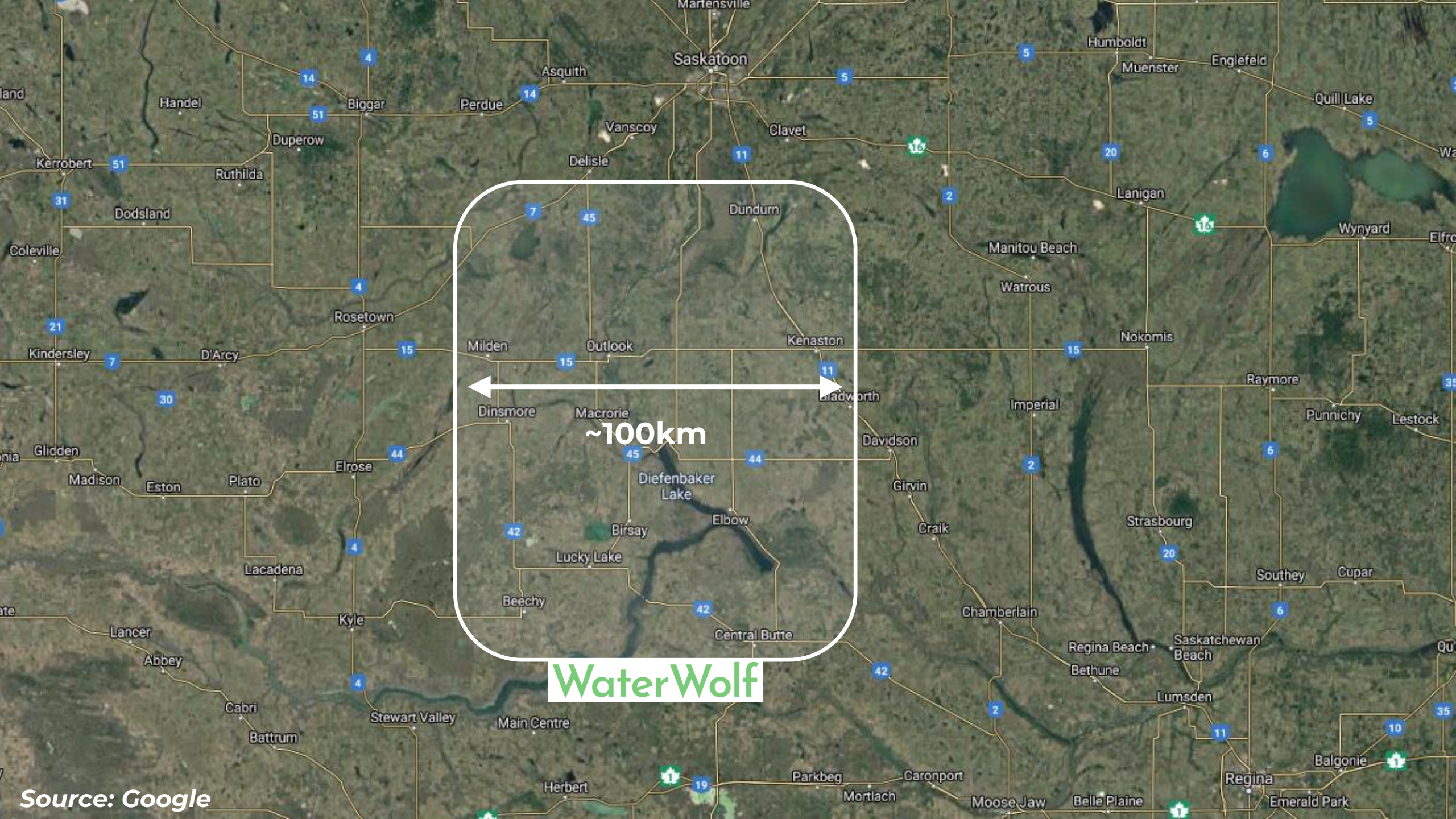
WATERWOLF DISTRICT PLANNING COMMISSION (DPC)

- DPC's assist and advise councils (i.e. non regulatory) in managing land use and development interests between jurisdictions
- DPC's provide a formal process for inter-municipal discussion about mutual interests
- WaterWolf was established primarily to discuss solutions to long term co-operative land use planning and infrastructure solutions
- WaterWolf evolved to address support with governance, environmental protection, development review and peer to peer networking
- Currently 28 member communities

PROJECT CATALYST

By June 30th, 2018 – All Tiers

- ✓ Get educated in asset management
- ✓ Develop and approve a policy and a strategy
- ✓ Develop an asset register for all asset classes

By June 30th, 2019 – Based on Tier

- ✓ Add the current condition of assets
- ✓ Document the desired condition of assets

By June 30th, 2020 – Based on Tier

- ✓ Identify the funding gap

By June 30th, 2022 – All Tiers

- ✓ Report back to council (monitor/improve)

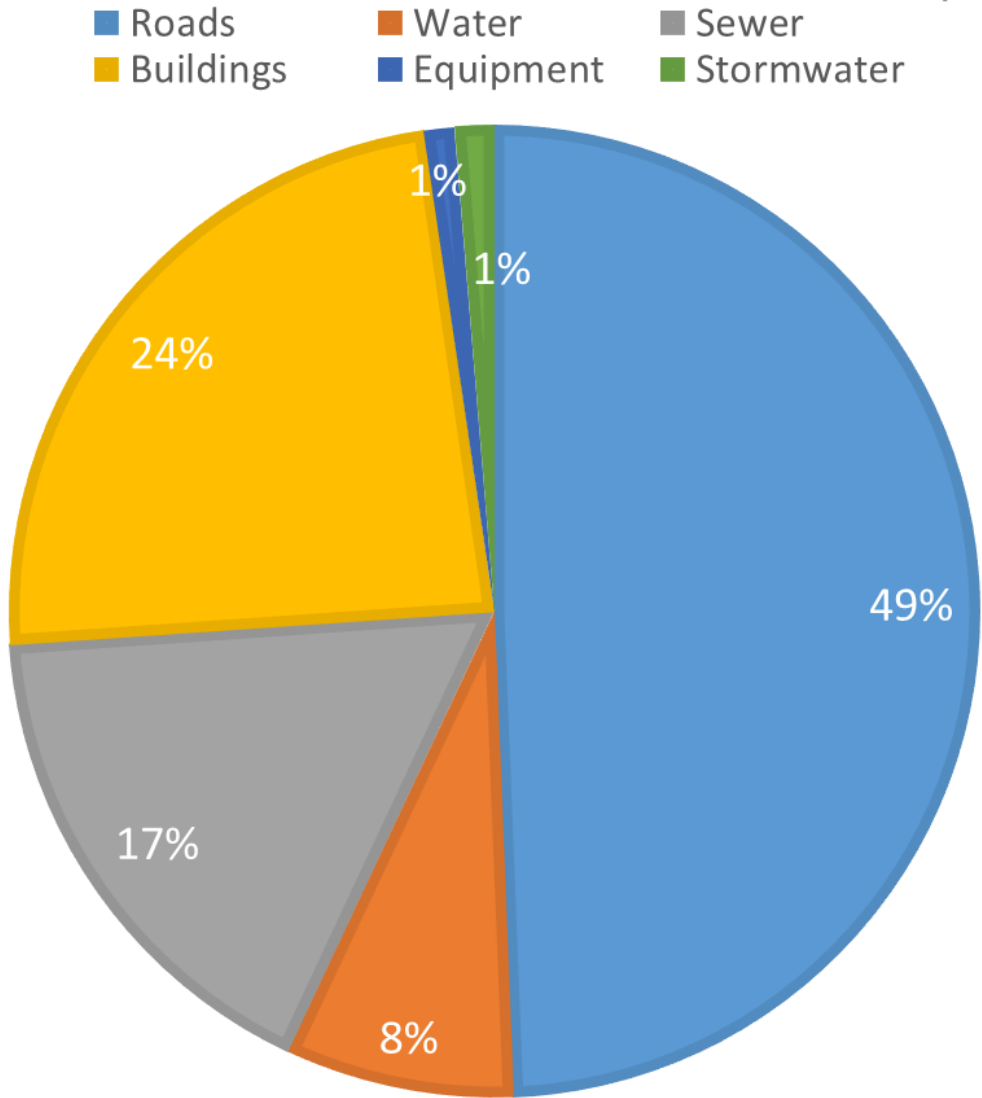

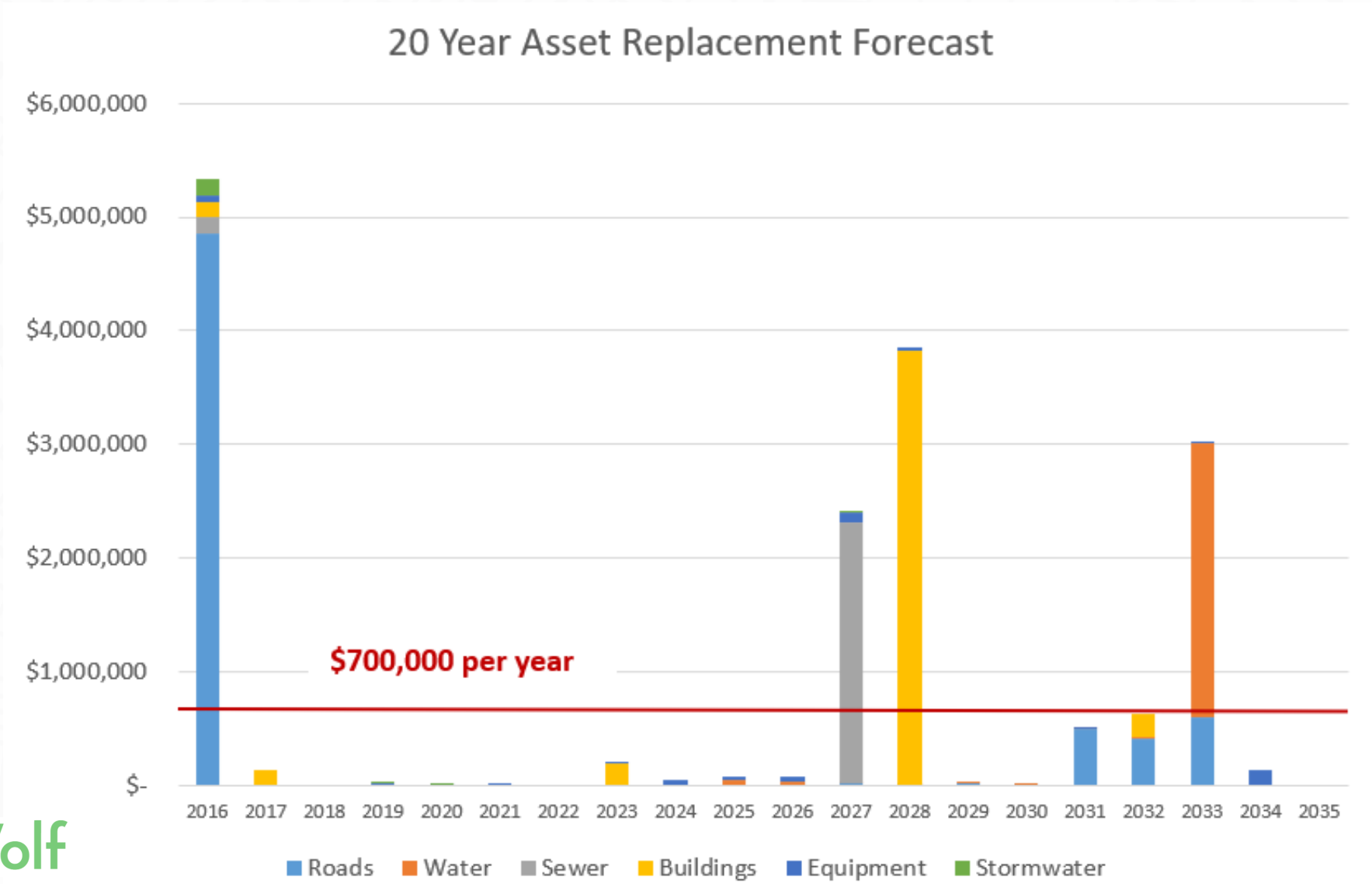

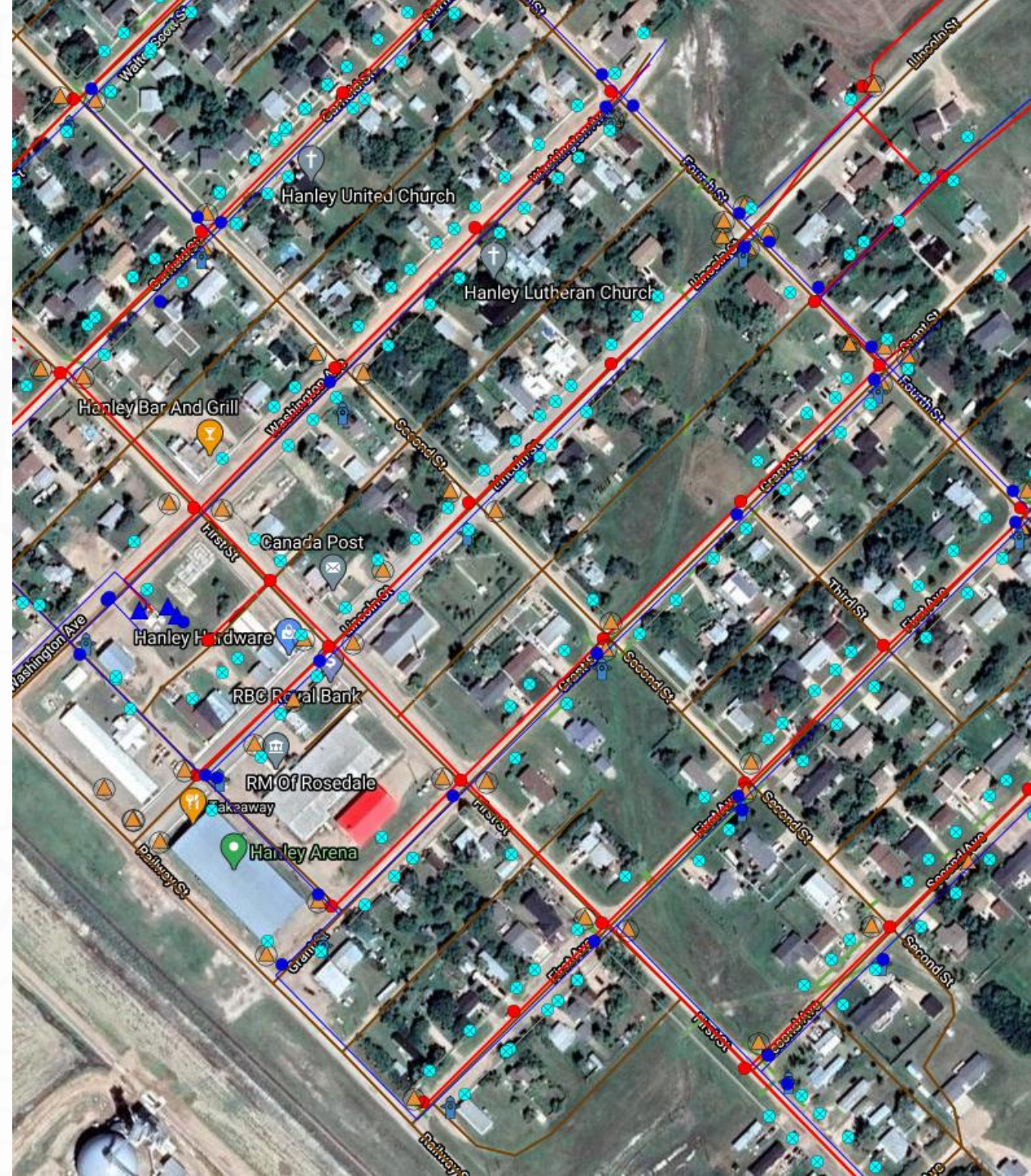
